we will meet on 21 and 22 July at the Summer School in Antwerp and I am looking forward to working together with you. Below, I send you a tentative draft program for these two days. Furthermore, I would like to ask you to do some informal preparatory work before you come to Antwerp (II). You may includes some of the information from your written country report you were asked to prepare for the International Journal for Education Law and Policy by the program director. ## **II.** Assignments

1. County Report A: Prepare a short (not more than 8 - 10 minutes) oral presentation as to the situation in your country, dealing with the following question:

- What is the factual situation in schools in your country concerning violence (against pupils/students and teachers)?
- What is the social, economic and cultural background of violence in schools in your country? Are there any specifics (e.g. violence against special groups like minorities, sexual assaults)?
- Which form takes violence in schools in your country? Are there new developments like "happy slapping", Internet mobbing ...?

2. Country Report B: Prepare a short (not more than 8 - 10 minutes) oral presentation dealing with specific programs and activities with respect to the prevention of violence in schools in your country. Consider the following questions (if possible):

• Are there violence prevention education and training packages developed by the ministry, school authorities or other agencies?

- Is a civility, citizenship and character education component included in the course of instruction?
- Are there special institutions (NGO, counselling agencies ...) which support schools and teachers in dealing with violence?
